

The HGGS Graduate School stands for innovative doctoral research in the humanities, social sciences and law at one of Europe's top-ranking institutions, Heidelberg University. It offers doctoral candidates a dynamic, collaborative research environment within a broad national and international network that crosses disciplinary boundaries and fosters new research projects in a range of strategic areas.

Inter- and transdisciplinarity are at the centre of the academic exchange at the HGGS. The Graduate School thus embraces the recommendations for interdisciplinary doctoral research by the League of European Research Universities, the British Academy and other renowned organizations and scholars in the EU and abroad and responds to the needs of young researchers to adapt to significant changes in academia and society. Bringing together a creative and supportive academic community of doctoral researcher, the HGGS encourages its members to develop original research ideas in dialogue with peers from different faculties.

The HGGS serves the doctoral community of six large faculties and is as such a strategic nexus for Field of Focus 3 »Cultural Dynamics in Globalised Worlds« and Field of Focus 4 »Self-regulation and regulation: individuals and societies« at Heidelberg University.

HGGS PROGRAMME

The programme for doctoral candidates includes a tailor-made curriculum with interdisciplinary seminars and workshops that facilitate critical debates about individual doctoral projects of HGGS members and about academic research in the context of 21st century challenges. Most courses are offered in a compact format to foster the intensive academic exchange whilst allowing the academic freedom to drive ahead individual doctoral work. Doctoral members can also design their own workshops or projects and publish the results with the support of the HGGS.

The HGGS supports doctoral initiatives through the Peer Mentoring scheme. Doctoral members can set up interdisciplinary groups in order to research key concepts, explore new ideas and debate contemporary challenges. With the financial and logistic support of the HGGS, the results of the research projects can be made accessible to a wider audience through exhibitions, publications, conferences or workshops.

DOCTORAL MEMBERS
